

## PHOTO REPORT ON HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES "OPEN YOUR EYES"

In July from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> this year, a humanitarian action was organized by the Corporation " POSCO INTERNATIONAL " (Korea), non-governmental organization " HEART TO HEART " (Korea) and non-governmental organization "SOGLEM AVLOD UCHUN" (Uzbekistan).



**Venue:** Fergana children multidisciplinary hospital.

**Period:** 22-26.07.2019 year (Fergana)

**Project content:**

- ✚ To hold free ophthalmic surgery as well as to make ophthalmic diagnosis children who are in the constant list of the hospital;
- ✚ To do master classes for local ophthalmologists how to make children's cataract surgery.



On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July 3 doctors from Cambodia and 5 members of delegation from Korea, as well as one representative of non-governmental organization "Soglom avlod uchun" arrived at the hospital.



**Operation process**

For the humanitarian action, a team of doctors brought the latest medical equipments, medicines and preparations for diagnostics and operations.

During a four-day charity event specialists of Corporate Planning team "Daewoo Textile" as well as some specialists who work in another divisions took part effectively.

The president of Daewoo Textile Mr. Cho Seung Hyun and the Administrative and Financial Director Mr. Son Won Kyung took an active part in this project.

## RESULTS OF THE HUMANITARIAN ACTION

On the 1<sup>st</sup> day 53 patients were examined and for 26 patients out of them operations were performed to remove cataracts and replace the lens of the eyes. Also during two days master classes for local ophthalmologists how to make children's cataract surgery were hold.

On the last day a joint meeting was held on the results of the charitable action. During the meeting, Heart to Heart gave out letters of appreciation to representatives of the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Uzbekistan, non-governmental organization "Soglom Avlod Uchun", doctors of the Regional Ophthalmologic Hospital for their assistance in carrying out this humanitarian project.



After the surgery, the patients thanked to the team of visiting doctors and volunteers for the opportunity to receive free treatment and restore their eyesight.
